ROBERT DOUGLAS Port Chester, NY (Deceased)


- Graduate of Springfield College

JOSEPH FARRELL Binghamton, NY (Deceased)


- Graduate of East Stroudsburg University & Penn State University

DR. JOHN F. FOLEY, CAA East Setauket, NY (Deceased)


- Graduated From Manhattan College and NYU With BS &MS in PE & Health. Doctoral From Indiana U. in Physical Education
